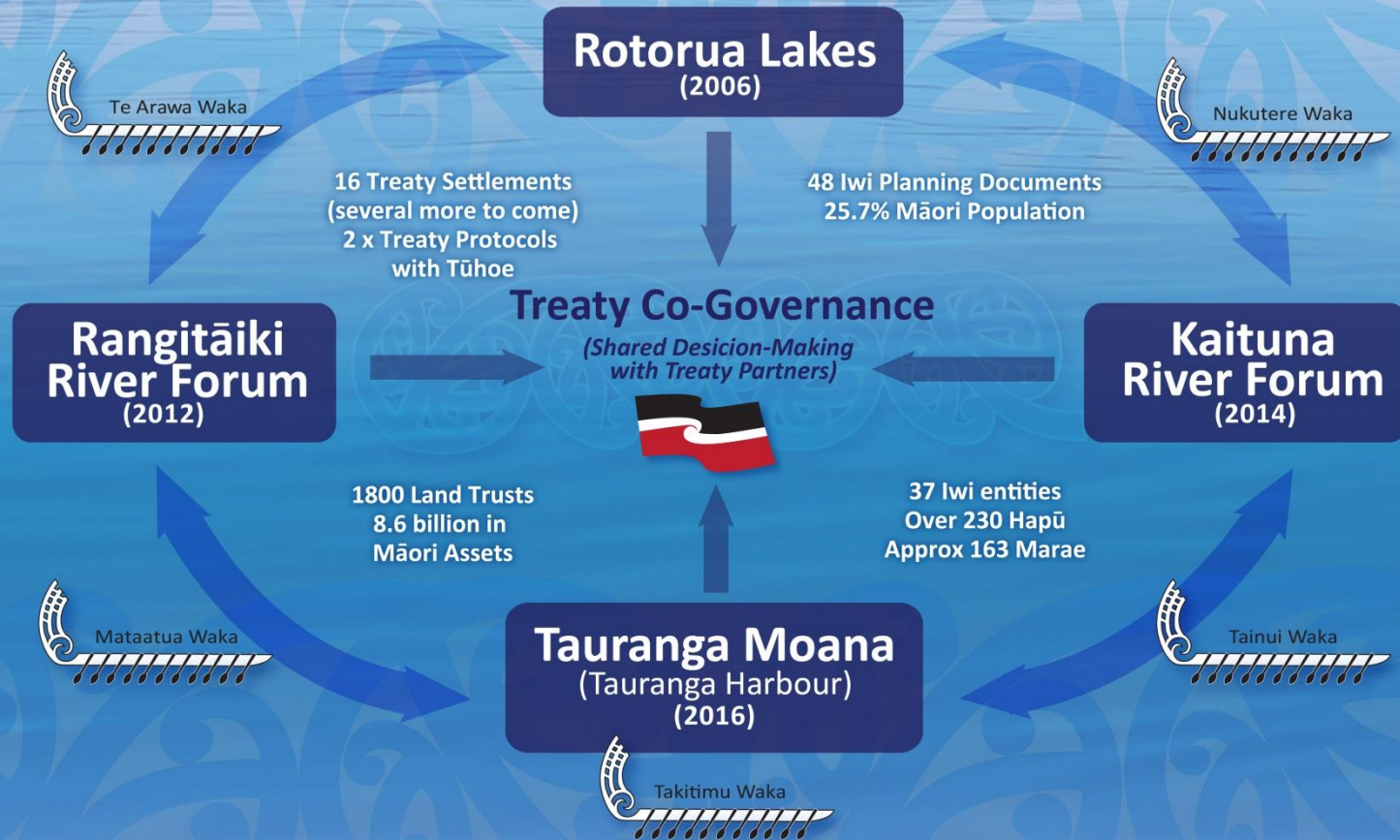

# Komiti Māori Hui

## Hosting at your marae

**Komiti Māori hui** are held at marae throughout the rohe. The hui are held every two months and the venue moves around the three Māori constituencies. Komiti Māori hui provide a forum for tangata whenua to provide input in to our mahi and for local issues to be heard by Toi Moana Bay of Plenty Regional Council.

**Kōwhiringa Marae mo ngā hui**  
Selecting a marae for the hui

The Māori Constituency Councillor whose region the meeting is being held in decides where the meeting will be held. If we receive requests from hapū to hold a hui on their Marae we try to accommodate these requests where possible.

**Rārangi Take Agenda**

The Komiti Māori agenda will be developed around the Marae venue. Reports will aim to be relevant to the haukaiinga. Topics can range from water management to sponsorship for environmental projects. Often tangata whenua presentations are focused on projects that have been supported by Toi Moana or help inform our work.

**Te rā o te hui** The day of the hui

Komiti Māori hui normally begin at 9.30am with a powhiri onto the Marae. How the powhiri is run is completely up to the hau kāinga. The hau kāinga may choose to hold the powhiri outside on the Marae ātea or within the Wharehau. Kai a kōutou te tikanga. The powhiri is followed by a short morning tea.

**Koha Costs**

Toi Moana will cover catering costs for morning tea and lunch as well as leave a koha in accordance with tikanga. Hosting our hui on a Marae can involve a lot of hard work and incur costs. Toi Moana are more than happy to accommodate with payment prior to the day of the hui.

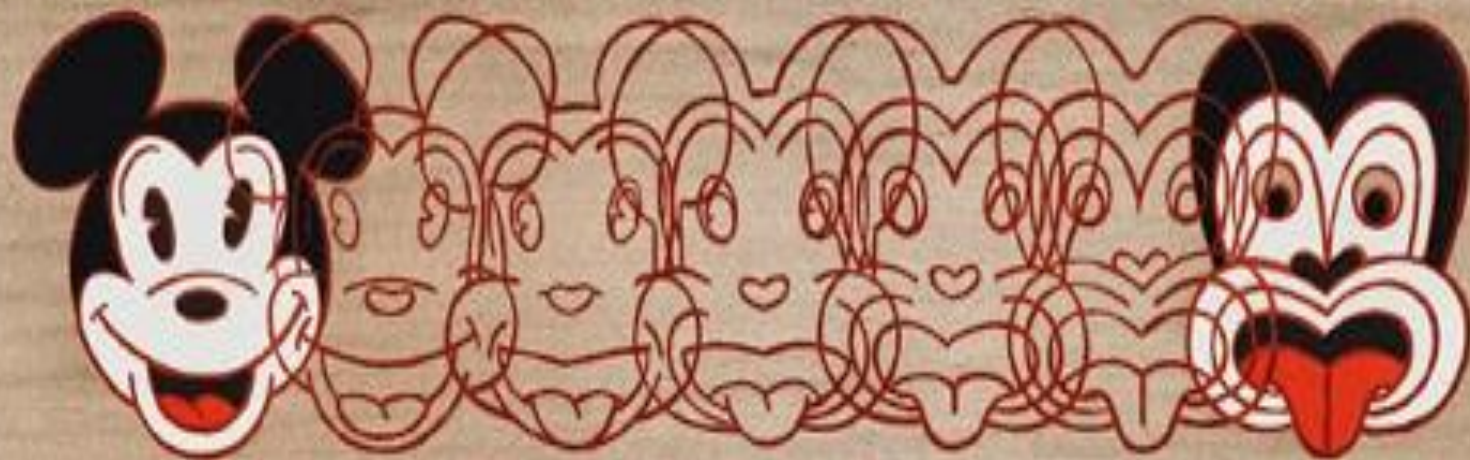

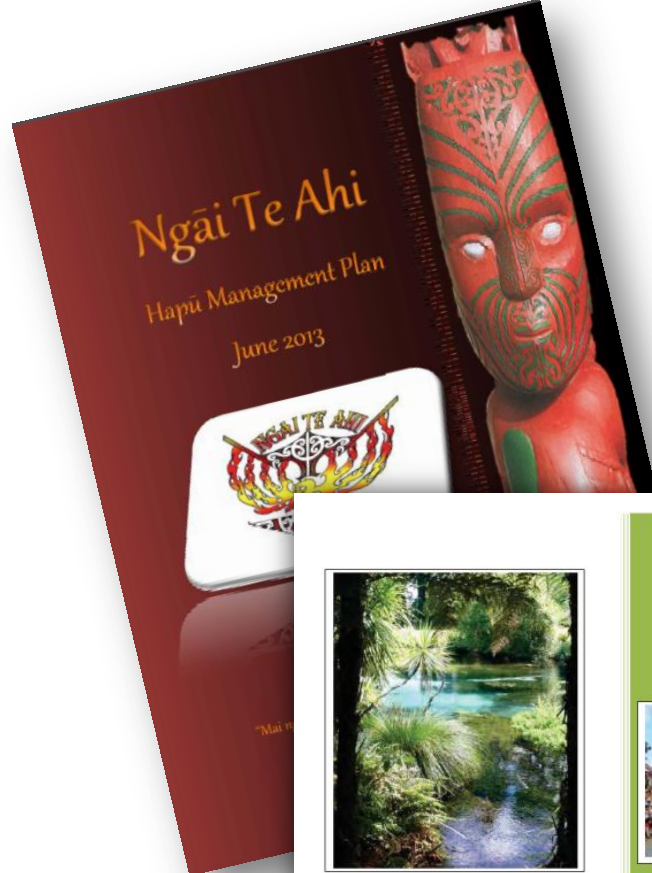

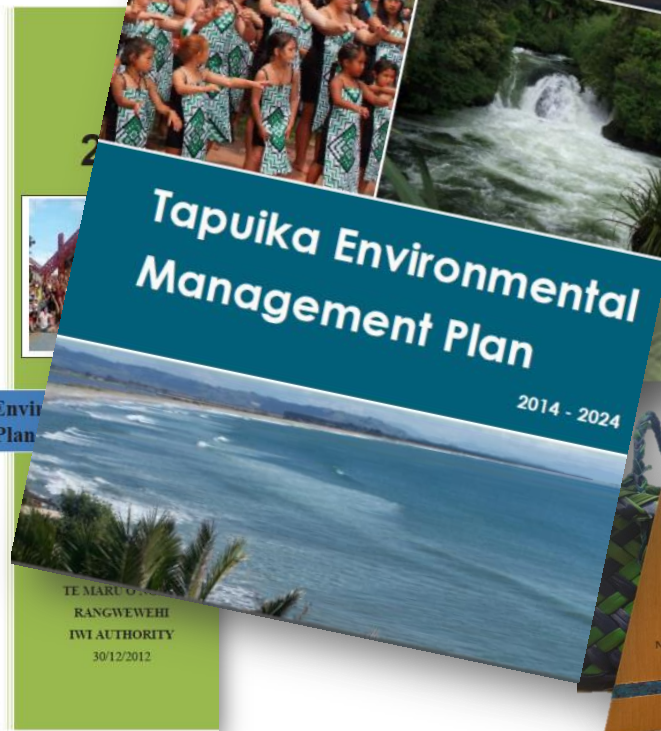
