Award Criteria: Applicants are expected, in no more than 5,000 words, to detail in what ways that they

 Have made a significant contribution over 10 years or more to the theory and practice of planning in Aotearoa/ New Zealand:

AND/OR

 Have developed through practice and/or original research advances to the theory and practice of planning in New Zealand and overseas:

AND/OR

 Have gained national or international recognition as a leader in the theory and practice of planning.

And that they

- Have made a major contribution to the affairs of the Institute at the national or branch level.
- Have nurtured and enhanced the professional practice of members of the Institute and the profile of the planning profession in Aotearoa/New Zealand.
- Have demonstrated and modelled the highest levels of professionalism and ethical conduct in their careers.

Judging Criteria:

- The candidate must demonstrate that they have addressed all the award criteria detailed above.
- The candidate's career exemplifies the highest standards of planning knowledge and skills and professional and ethical conduct.
