ABSTRACT GUIDELINES

In responding please note the following key points:

Your submission should have a focus on learning outcomes rather than a show and tell approach.

Preference will be given to submissions that demonstrate innovation and new approaches.

Submissions that allow a degree of interactivity with attendees are preferred.

Multi-speaker (panel) sessions are encouraged.

All abstracts must be submitted in the prescribed format to: <u>vanessa.white@planning.org.nz</u> by Wednesday 31 August 2016.

Subject line of email should be: Conf2017 – 'your surname'. Abstract attachment name should be: Abstract - 'your surname'. NOTE: Attachment must be a Word file



- All presenting authors must register and pay to attend the conference, they must attend at least the full day of their presentation and preferably the full conference.
- The presenting authors name should be bolded and all author affiliations included.
- Abstracts should be no longer than 250 words.
- Abstracts should be submitted in 14 point Arial font for the Title and 10 point Arial font for the body text.
- The abstract must be single-spaced and have a clear line space between paragraphs.
- Abstracts should be text only. Graphics, pictures or graphs should not be submitted.
- Abstracts must be free of typographical and grammatical errors.
- Submission of abstracts should be by email only. If you do not have access to online facilities please contact Vanessa White at NZPI.
- Submission of abstracts implies the author's agreement to publish the full paper in the final Conference programme and any other publications associated with the conference, including the website. If it's successful the full paper (3-5 pages) is due for submission by Friday 17 February 2017 at the latest.
- Successful papers should be presented by the author/s. If the author is unable to present the paper then you may use a substitute presenter.
- Acceptance of abstracts does not imply any payment from the conference committee. Authors must arrange and pay their own accommodation, travel etc, to attend the conference, unless otherwise stated.
- Acceptance or otherwise is at the discretion of NZPI, whose decision is final.
