





#### Affordability context

- Maori and Pasifika generally experience poorer housing conditions compared to other New Zealanders
- Maori make up nearly 50% of state housing tenants
- More likely to live in overcrowded homes/ health deterioration/stress
- Majority of Maori spending 31 54% of household income on housing costs (rent/mortgage)
- Maori population expected to triple 2051
- Income drop to below \$25,000 per household per annum



#### Sub regional context

The Western Bay sub region in context

- 44,000 acres of Maori land zoned rural
- 1200 acres of Maori land zoned residential
- Ideally situated, close to services, schools, employment and amenities
- Maori population expected to triple by 2051, to 284,000, yet on average only 1 house per annum built over last 10 years on Maori land
- Only two papakainga built nationally in Tauranga. One without collective support 9 years to build, one with collective support 2 years to build.
- A collective approach needed to ensure success in a timely manner

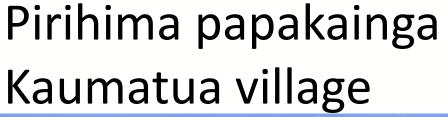

#### Regional Infrastructure Fund 2012

- Funding the Infrastructure to support the construction of 252 new homes will
  provide immediate and direct benefits to 252 families and potentially 1222
  individual residents by providing quality affordable housing. Productive use of
  Maori land.
- Improved whanau wellbeing: reduce health problems, improve education and employment opportunities.
- An estimated capital housing construction spend of \$63.8 million.
- Generates \$53.1 million in additional GDP.
- Supports 1,128 full time equivalents (FTE) i.e. Jobs.
- Potentially from 25 new families (10%) coming to Tauranga and will spend \$1.13 million per annum, that generate \$1.08 million additional GDP and support an additional 19 FTE's.
- Increase the weekly discretionary income for the 252 households
- Increase in capital land value of equal to at least the value of the 252 new homes built and estimated \$30 to \$42 million.
- Potential annual rates income of \$71,082.88.

- 86 home ownership
- 6 month process
- 40 formal conditional offers
- First 15 whanau agreed subsidy for house and land package
- 6 whanau
- 20 whanau
- Stage Two launches Friday direct to mums and dads/ 28 Nga Potiki sites
