Land, air and sea: regions to benefit from NZ Upgrade

Regional New Zealand will be a hive of activity in the coming months as the New Zealand Upgrade Programme delivers on its promise to modernise our infrastructure, prepare for climate change and help grow our economy.

As part of the <u>\$12 billion NZ Upgrade Programme</u> announced by the Government last month, \$300 million was allocated for capital projects in regional New Zealand.

The first package of regional projects – worth about \$190 million – has been announced by Regional Economic Development Minister Shane Jones at an infrastructure seminar today.

"Today I'm announcing capital investments in land, air and sea assets that will enhance regional economic opportunities, create jobs, boost infrastructure resilience and help our regions thrive," Shane Jones said.

"This funding boost has allowed us to get projects underway that may not have been an exact fit with the Provincial Growth Fund criteria but were worthy investments nonetheless.

"We're announcing investments in Northland, Bay of Plenty, Hawke's Bay, Taranaki, Otago, West Coast, Canterbury and Southland ...

Protecting wetlands on private property

Private land-owners are being urged to protect freshwater wetlands in their own back yard. Just over 90 percent of New Zealand's original wetlands have been lost, and a series of satellite images taken around the country by Forest and Bird show 13 percent of that total were damaged or destroyed between 2001 and 2015. Forest and Bird and the National Wetland Trust want to make sure the message gets across: that it's important to save what's left, half of which is on private land, at risk of being cleared or drained. Forest and Bird's chief conservation advisor Kevin Hackwell told Kathryn Ryan wetlands provide a vital environmental service and yet they are among our most degraded natural environments ...

Proposed new measures to improve Aotearoa's air quality

Improved air quality to support better health and environmental wellbeing is the focus of proposed amendments to air quality regulations, says the Associate Minister for the Environment, Hon Nanaia Mahuta.

"Although our air quality is good in most places, during winter certain places have spikes in air pollution, mainly from burning wood and coal for home heating. This can have severe health impacts for several communities.

"The Government is seeking feedback on its <u>proposed amendments</u> to some provisions of the National Environmental Standards for Air Quality. The aim of the amendments is to better control the release of fine particles into our air ...

The Case for Higher Ground

Denial is not a resilience strategy. But when it comes to managing change — and especially climate change we're more likely to stick our heads in the proverbial sand, maintaining and protecting the status quo, than acknowledging and planning for the inevitable rising tides. That, too, needs to change. Along with carbon mitigation plans and investments in adaptation, cities must also address the fact that attempting to preserve their urban fabric as-is may inherently lead to increased risk over time and the possibility of catastrophic loss in the future. What if these communities begin a shift toward higher ground instead?

As it is, existing regulations and policies in coastal cities typically promote adaptation strategies to protect valuable real estate from the impacts of sea level-rise and coastal storms. We know, however, that seas will continue to rise for the foreseeable future for several hundred years, according to the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change — although climate models disagree on how high and by when. While the timing is uncertain, we can be sure the future of our coastal communities will involve much higher sea levels ...
