The problem with the 'shovel ready' strategy for post-Covid-19 rebuild

The public health response to Covid-19 showed New Zealand at its best. What will the economic response reveal? Iain White, a professor of environmental planning, on the risks ahead.

Crises reveal. They bring the nature of societies to light. From the differing attitude to experts between countries, to who really are the essential workers, to the spatial inequalities in health care provision or access to greenspace. Crises also change our perception of time. Just as days will feel like decades for some, so too, will decades worth of decisions be determined in a matter of days. The recent government call for "shovel ready" infrastructure projects to kickstart the recovery promises a scale of investment that holds real potential to transform our towns and cities.
