## Planners Cautiously Welcome Government's Fast Track Consenting During COVID-19 Recovery

NZPI Media Release

The New Zealand Planning Institute (NZPI) cautiously welcomes the Government's announcement of fast-tracked consenting for eligible development and infrastructure projects, but says it is important that environmental and community outcomes are not sacrificed in the process.

Minister for the Environment David Parker announced this week that Cabinet has approved the fast tracking of consent processes and the legislation is expected to be passed in June. The Minister will identify projects to go into the fast track resource consenting process and these will be considered by an Expert Consenting Panel chaired by a current or retired Environment Court Judge or senior lawyer.

This fast tracking is part of the Government's approach to getting key infrastructure and development projects underway during the COVID-19 recovery phase.

"Investment in infrastructure is central to the Government's economic plan to keep New Zealanders in jobs. We have already signalled major projects as part of the \$12 billion New Zealand Upgrade project," says Minister Parker ...
