Team Leader Consents Processing

This role will lead the delivery of the resource consenting, LIM, building and customer experience components of the environmental planning team. Reporting directly to the manager – environmental planning, you will be part of the leadership group and will contribute to the engagement, culture and growth of the team by role modelling our values and key leadership qualities. You will invest in ensuring that your team is delivering a best practice, customer centric service with a focus on continuous improvement. This role is all about people and relationships. As such you will be adept at building and maintaining relationships with your team, the wider organisation and our customers. Team Leader Ecology
